Scope & Content: This collection contains original postcards with pictures of people, places, animals, and things from the Menominee Indian Reservation.

Images depict lakes, fishing gear, Menominee people, birch bark teepees and wigwams, animals, and reservation buildings. Each postcard is titled "Land of the Menominee Indians," with the exception of the postcards depicting St. Michael Catholic Church and two wigwams.
